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Iowa College Aid Makes Financial Literacy Training Affordable for Iowa Educators *Training will Prepare 75 Educators to Teach Financial Literacy in Iowa Schools*

Des Moines, IA, July 12, 2010 – The Iowa College Student Aid Commission (Iowa College Aid) announced today that it has subsidized the cost of the Family Economics and Financial Education Project Training (FEFE), to be held at Iowa State University July 14, 2010 through July 16, 2010, for 75 Iowa educators. The cutting-edge training program is designed to strengthen a school’s ability to raise the personal financial capabilities of Iowa students.

“Financial literacy is a key initiative of our agency,” said Karen Misjak, executive director of Iowa College Aid. “Students need to learn concepts such as budgeting, saving, using credit cards wisely, and making smart borrowing decisions before they go to college and enter the workforce,” explained Misjak. “We didn’t want the cost of the training to be out of reach for our Iowa educators. By subsidizing the training, we were able to bring the \$465 registration fee down to \$75. With an affordable price tag, the response to the training was overwhelming. There is a waiting list of educators hopeful that there will be an opening.”

The Iowa Core Curriculum, which was signed into law on May 1, 2008, requires that all students leave school prepared to succeed in the complex new, 21st century. Essential concepts and skill sets include employability skills, financial literacy, health literacy, and technology literacy. The curriculum must be fully implemented in Iowa high schools by July 1, 2012, and in kindergarten through eighth grade by 2014-2015.

Through interactive workshops, educators attending the training will gain the skills and confidence to teach financial education, ultimately empowering future generations to make smart financial decisions. In addition, training attendees will receive hard copies of the following curriculum:

- Take Charge of Your Finances semester/trimester course (a \$340 value),
- Get Ready to Take Charge of Your Finances introductory course (a \$160 value), and
- Best Practices facilitation binder with teaching tips to customize each lesson (a \$50 value).
