Dear Ms. Kolar:

When the associate program was reviewed for continuing accreditation during the Fall 2009 cycle, the Commission granted continuing accreditation with the condition that a Follow-Up Report be submitted in two (2) years. The report is due in the NLNAC office by February 15, 2012.

A Follow-Up Report is required because the Commissioners determined that your program is not in compliance with one or two Accreditation Standards. The details were included in the accreditation decision letter mailed to you following the Commission meeting. A copy is enclosed for your convenience.

The Report will be reviewed by the Evaluation Review Panel, which will make a recommendation to the Commissioners on whether the report demonstrates that you are now in compliance with the Standard(s). If the Commissioners find that you are in compliance with the Standard(s), you will be granted continuing accreditation for the remainder of the eight year accreditation cycle (i.e., eight years from the time of the most recent site visit). If the Commissioners determine you are not in compliance with the Standard(s), your program will be denied continuing accreditation.

The Follow-Up Report should address the entire Standard(s) in a similar manner as required for the Self-Study Report. It is important to emphasize those areas that caused the Commission to determine that you were not in compliance with the Standard(s).

In addition to the narrative discussion of the Standard, you should submit any documentary evidence that will substantiate your compliance. For example, if the Follow-Up Report is to address Faculty, please enclose a faculty profile form and current CVs for all full-time and part-time faculty members, along with plans of study and demonstrated progress toward completion of advanced degrees for any faculty lacking those credentials. If the Follow-Up Report is to address Curriculum, enclose a curriculum plan/program of study, copies of abbreviated course syllabi, examples of evaluation methods, and other related curriculum materials.

This letter is formal notification of the action taken by the National League for Nursing Accrediting Commission at its meeting on February 25-26, 2010. The Board of Commissioners granted the associate nursing program continuing accreditation with the condition that your program submit a Follow-Up Report in 2 years. If the Follow-Up Report is accepted by the Commission, the next evaluation visit will be scheduled for Fall 2017.

Deliberations centered on the Self-Study Report, the School Catalog, the Site Visitors' Report, and the recommendation for accreditation proposed by the Program Evaluators and the Evaluation Review Panel. (See Summary of Deliberations and Recommendation of the Evaluation Review Panel.)

The Board of Commissioners identified the following evidence of non-compliance as well as areas needing development:

Evidence of Non-Compliance by Accreditation Standard and Criterion

Standard 2 Faculty and Staff, Criteria 2.1 and 2.6

- All full-time faculty are not credentialed with a minimum of a master's with a major in nursing. (4 of the 14 full-time faculty members do not hold a master's degree in nursing.)
- The number and utilization of non-nurse faculty and staff are not sufficient to achieve the program goals and outcomes.

Areas Needing Development by Accreditation Standard

Standard 3 Students

- Review and refine public documents (paper and electronic) to ensure that they are current, accurate, complete, and consistent, including the correct credit hour ratio.

Standard 6 Outcomes

- Consistently document the use of data to inform program decision-making.
- Implement strategies to increase employer and graduate survey return rates.

A Follow-Up Report requires the nursing education unit to demonstrate paper compliance with a specific Accreditation Standard or Standards. The Follow-Up Report for the associate program is to address Standard 2 Faculty and Staff. The report is to be submitted to NLNAC in the Spring 2012 Cycle by February 15, 2012. At the time of its review of the Follow-Up Report, the Commission will either affirm the time of the next evaluation visit or remove the nursing program from the list of accredited programs. We recommend contacting a member of the NLNAC professional staff after reviewing the enclosed.

On behalf of the Commission, we thank you and your colleagues for your commitment to quality nursing education. By choosing to have accreditation by NLNAC, your nursing program demonstrates a continued interest in having the program measured against the highest national standards of quality in nursing education. 

The Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology (JRCERT) appreciated the opportunity to evaluate the associate degree radiography program sponsored by St. Luke's College. The JRCERT is the only agency recognized by the U.S. Department of Education for the accreditation of traditional and distance delivery educational programs in radiography, radiation therapy, magnetic resonance, and medical dosimetry. Specialized accreditation awarded by the JRCERT offers institutions significant value by providing peer evaluation and by assuring the public of quality professional education in the radiologic sciences.

The continuing accreditation status of the program was considered by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology. The program was evaluated according to the **Standards for an Accredited Educational Program in Radiologic Sciences (2002)**. The JRCERT awards:

ACCREDITATION FOR A PERIOD OF EIGHT YEARS.

The maximum duration that may be awarded by the Joint Review Committee on Education in Radiologic Technology in this category is eight years.

An interim report will be required. The projected date for submission of the interim report is the First Quarter of 2013. The JRCERT will provide program officials adequate notice of the due date for submission of the interim report. Based on the interim report, the JRCERT will determine if the accreditation award of 8 years will be maintained or reduced and the continuing accreditation process expedited.

If the accreditation award is maintained, the next site visit is tentatively scheduled for the First Quarter of 2017.


