

Refund Policy

Federal regulations require that each institution publish its refund policy and make the information available to students upon request. Examples of the application of this policy are available upon request. Because the University of Nebraska-Lincoln does not charge full tuition at the beginning of the enrollment period, this is a billing policy rather than a refund policy. Tuition and fees will be billed to students receiving financial aid who withdraw according to the following schedule:

Withdrawal Time	Percentage of Tuition/ Fees Billed
1st Week	0%
2nd Week	25%
3rd Week	50%
4th Week	75%
5th Week	100%

Any refunds from payment of tuition, fees, and campus housing charges or any refunds created by a reduction in charges resulting from withdrawal from classes may be returned to financial aid funds if you received federal financial aid during that semester.

Return of Title IV Funds

All students receiving federal Title IV financial assistance who withdraw will be subject to a calculation that determines 'earned' and 'unearned' Title IV funds.

Calculation of Title IV assistance earned

Up through the 60 percent point in time, the percentage of assistance earned is equal to the percentage of the payment period or period of enrollment for which it was awarded that was completed as of the day the student withdrew. If the student withdrawal occurs after the 60 percent point, then the percentage is 100 percent. That earned percentage is applied to the total amount of Title IV grant and loan assistance that was disbursed (and that could have been disbursed) to the student for the payment period or enrollment for which it was awarded as of the day the student withdrew.

Calculation of Title IV assistance not earned

The amount of Title IV grant and loan assistance not earned by the student is calculated by determining the complement of the percentage of assistance the student earned and applying it to the total amount of grant and loan assistance that was disbursed (and that could have been disbursed) to the student for the payment period or period of enrollment as of the day the student withdrew.

The amount the school must return to the federal aid programs is the lesser of the unearned amount of Title IV assistance or the institutional charges incurred, multiplied by the unearned percentage. Title IV funds will be returned to the various federal aid programs in the following order:

2. Federal Subsidized Stafford Loan

What do I do if I'm receiving Financial Aid?

Many students at the University of Nebraska Omaha receive financial aid to pay for part, or all of their tuition and fees balance. The following information will help you determine how financial aid is disbursed and refunded to your student account.

Financial Aid Disbursements

If you have met all of the requirements from the Financial Aid Office, financial aid funds are disbursed to your student account approximately 10 days prior to the beginning of each semester. (In the summer sessions, financial aid will be disbursed 10 days prior to the first day of your first session.) Delays to the disbursement of your aid could be due to missing information or ineligibility for funds. Please contact the Financial Aid Office with questions concerning eligibility.

Financial Aid Refunds

Financial aid can be received several ways. Scholarship checks that are sent to UNOmaha and made payable to you must be processed by our Financial Aid Office. The check is then made available for you to pick up at the Cashiering/Student Accounts Office, EAB 109. You must pay your balance in full by personal check or cash and present a current student I.D. before we release your scholarship check to you. If your balance is more than the value of your scholarship, you must apply the scholarship to your account and pay the difference. We cannot apply a scholarship check made payable to you without your signature.

Other scholarships and financial aid will generally be applied directly to your account. If your balance is covered and there are excess funds due to you, a refund will be processed for you.

All refund payments are issued and mailed from the State of Nebraska Treasurer's Office. From the date financial aid is applied to your tuition and fees account, it generally takes 7 to 10 days for you to receive your refund payment by check and 5-7 days by Direct Deposit however, holidays, month-end processing and large volumes can result in additional time.

Direct deposit allows UNO to disburse refunds owed on your tuition and fees balance or excess financial aid directly to the bank account of your choice. By providing us with your bank routing number and general banking information, we will process your refund through the State of Nebraska, who will send an electronic deposit to your bank account. The process saves on mailing time, getting your refund to you more quickly.

A notification email is sent to students regarding tuition statements on the 10th day of the term. The total amount is due by the date on the billing statement. When the account is not paid by the due date, late fees and university holds are placed on accounts and on the fourth day a second bill is mailed to the student "return receipt restricted". With this second billing statement, the following information will go to the student:

- Student Account will be placed on University hold
- Indication that this is the "Final Notice"
- A \$20 late fee will be added to the bill
- If bill is not paid or a formal payment agreement* has not been signed by the student by the due date on this notice, the student will be dis-enrolled. A dis-enrollment letter will be sent to the student via certified, return receipt mail. Copies of this letter will be sent to the respective academic dean and program director/graduate committee chairperson.
- The student cannot re-enroll during this semester
- If the tuition/fees are paid along with a \$100 re-enrollment fee, the student will be eligible for enrollment for the next semester.
- Please note that disenrollment may affect a student's financial aid and/or ability to defer student loans.

* A formal payment agreement will not be considered for students who receive adequate financial aid dollars. A formal payment agreement constitutes a written document signed by the student which would include the total amount owed and a schedule of payments not to exceed the length of the term. No modifications can be made to this agreement. Student cannot miss or be late with a scheduled payment, or they will be subject to disenrollment.

CHAPTER 85

STATE UNIVERSITY, STATE COLLEGES, AND POSTSECONDARY EDUCATION

85-173. Defunct colleges; records; University of Nebraska; depository.

The trustees or officers of any college or other institution of learning, whether incorporated or not, upon going out of existence or ceasing to function as an educational institution, may turn over its records of all grades, attained by its students, to the registrar of the University of Nebraska, to be preserved by his office as a central depository for this valuable historical material.

85-174. Defunct colleges; records; duties of registrar.


The office of registrar of the University of Nebraska is hereby designated the central depository for the records of such educational institutions in this state as have ceased to exist, or may cease to exist in the future. The registrar of the University of Nebraska shall, where possible, collect the records of such extinct educational institution, and have the supervision, care, custody and control of said records. The registrar of the University of Nebraska, having the records of such educational institutions, if any, shall, when requested, prepare transcripts of such grade records which may at any time become necessary to the former student for further scholastic work at other institutions, for certification for teaching and other professional positions. Whenever such transcript is made, and after it has been compared with the original, it shall be certified by the registrar of the University of Nebraska, and shall thereafter be considered and accepted as evidence and, for all other purposes, the same as the original could be. For the preparation of such transcript the registrar of the University of Nebraska may charge a nominal fee for services rendered.
