Principal Responsibilities: The majority of my work experience has been teaching undergraduate laboratory courses including Introductory Geology, Principles of Paleontology, Evolution of the Earth, and Introduction to Environmental Science. In this position, I was responsible for creating my curriculum and syllabus as well as setting up all laboratory equipment and designing the labs. In Introductory Geology, I created labs, dealing with minerals, the rock cycle, volcanic eruptions and earthquakes, seismic waves, weathering and erosion, glacial processes, and protecting our natural resources. We also talked about the local ecology and our natural resources. I led field trips to explore the geology and ecology around our campus. In Principles of Paleontology our labs focused around 2 major projects. One focused on the ecosystem of Florida Bay. Collections of shells collected by the Amoco Corporation in the 1980s were counted and catalogued. My students then used statistical analyses to determine the similarities and differences between and among the different communities in the bay. During this section of the course, I familiarized my students with the geology and local ecology of the Florida Bay area. We looked at the different environments along the bay and how the ecology changed, thus altering the species of molluscs and gastropods that were present there. Our second major laboratory exercise dealt with morphometrics. Using the same shell collections, my students measured different morphometric features on each of the shells. Using SPSS statistical software, my students determined how morphological changes related to environment and identified particular morphospecies that were present in each ecosystem. In Principles of Paleontology I was also responsible for leading 2 all day field trips to different Silurian and Devonian fossil sites around area. For Evolution of the Earth, I focused much of my course material on the different Invertebrate Phyla. Each week dealt with a different phylum. The students learned the major characteristics of the phylum and what main features distinguished these animals from other higher life forms. We also discussed how the environment and ecology played a role in the survival of these species. The final few labs focused on the interrelationships between the phyla and cladistic analyses. I also taught and designed the curriculum for environmental science. As one of the principal designers of the Environmental Science labs, we focused on water quality and preserving natural resources. I found that it was essential for my students to participate in hands-on labs where we tested the quality of our environment on campus. The students really enjoyed testing the soil and water around the very building we worked in. They were surprised how many contaminants we actually had in our water. As a research assistant to the Paleontology Repository I was responsible for cataloging and databasing a 5 ton bequest from Glenn Crossman for Paleontological repository. The rest of my research for the collection involved organizing and databasing paleontology collection in repository and keeping the NMITA database up to date. The curator and I also began to create an interactive geological map of the 99 counties of Iowa. When elementary school students visited the university, I would talk to them about the local ecology, geology, and the importance of respecting and protecting our environmental resources.
